



Lenten Devotionals



Puerto Rico Mission Trip

On Sunday, February 26th we commissioned Lila Wright and JR Wilson who will participate in a Mission Trip to San Juan, Puerto Rico, March 4th to 11th with a group from the Charleston Atlantic Presbytery, to help provide relief from lasting damage from hurricanes Maria and Irma. The projects will be led by Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. The team is staying in a former parish manse which serves to house volunteers working with PDA. Please pray for these and all on the trip as they step out in faith to serve others.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance remains committed to our siblings in Puerto Rico through Hurricanes Irma, Maria and Fiona's recovery in addition to the January 2020 series of earthquakes in the southwestern region. More than \$3.2 million in grants have gone to Puerto Rico to support the work of congregations and local organizations responding to the disasters, and over 2,000 PDA volunteers have worked in rebuilding projects since 2017.

Puerto Rico is a territory of the US about 8 times the size of Hilton Head and population 3.3 million. On September 20, 2017 hurricane Maria as a high category 4 hit the island directly killing nearly 3000 and causing 90 billion dollars in damage to the entire infrastructure and homes. Irma had just gone by it 2 weeks prior on 9/7/17 causing significant damage. Fiona occurred 11/22. On top of all of that Puerto Rico is earthquake prone, the last major one occurring 1/7/20

March Change Can Make a Change (CCMAC) is This Child Here

For the month of March, CCMAC will support This Child Here founded by Rev. Robert Gamble to support the people of Ukraine. Rev. Gamble and his team are located in Izmail, Ukraine and welcome displaced families. They meet families in grocery stores and invite them to join their activities at their center. They are conducting a blanket project with funds donated. For 3 hours on Sunday afternoon, they hold a woman's center with a time of games, art therapy and conversation led by a psychologist. Seventy two mothers have participated. The largest part of their work is with children who come in 4 age groups from 4 year olds to older teens. A litany of crafts, choir, guitar, English lessons and games led by the psychologist to build trust and community are shared with the children.

Rev. Gamble thanks the members of LPC for their ongoing support.



Change Can Make A Change for April is One Great Hour of Sharing

Millions of people lack access to sustainable food sources, clean water, sanitation, education, and opportunity.

The three programs supported by One Great Hour of Sharing - Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, the Presbyterian Hunger Program, and Self-Development of People - all work in different ways to serve individuals and communities in need. From initial disaster response to ongoing community development, their work fits together to provide people with safety, sustenance, and hope. The offering will be collected on Easter, April 9th, with envelopes provided in the bulletin.

Response to Earthquake

LPC is continuing to collect a special offering for the people of Syria and Turkey for the next few weeks. Monies raised will be sent to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) to address urgent needs and provide humanitarian aid. 2022 Surplus Funds 10%

Mission Ministry has voted to send the 10% of the 2022 surplus funds to charitable organizations on the ground dealing with the earthquake in Turkey and Syria and the war in Ukraine. All of those chosen have been awarded 4 stars from Charity Navigator. Those organizations are CARE (\$1,000); Water Missions (\$1,500); All Hands and Hearts (\$1,500); Save the Children (\$1,500); World Central Kitchen (\$1,500).



Our next book is "Trouble The Water" by Rebecca Dwight Bruff. We will discuss the book on Tuesday, May 2nd and May 9th at 5:00pm in the parlor. This novel is inspired by the extraordinary life of Robert Smalls who was born into slavery and became a member of the U.S. Congress.

"With this stunning debut novel, Rebecca Bruff establishes herself as an exciting new voice in historical fiction" Cassandra King Conroy, author of "Moonrise", and founding honorary chair of the Pat Conroy Literary Center.

There is a bust of Robert Smalls outside the Tabernacle Baptist Church, 901 Craven St., Beaufort. In addition, his former home is located at 511 Prince St., Beaufort.

How Rebecca came to write this novel is quite interesting and she will share that with us on Tuesday, May 9th at 5:00pm in the parlor. After both sessions, there will be the option to go out to dinner at a local restaurant.

Adult Sunday School

Our children enjoyed lessons on Noah's Ark, The 10 Commandments, Abraham and Sarah, and Isaac and Rebecca during January and February. Teacher and LPC member Phyllis Willever teaches this class at 10:30 on the second and fourth Sundays of each month in the classroom near the nursery. Sunday April 23rd LPC will welcome Rev. Martin B. Copenhaver

as our guest preacher and seminar leader (One service only at 10:30am)

Rev. Copenhaver, pastor, scholar, writer, and brother of LPC member, Chad, will base his sermon and seminar on his book *Jesus Is the Question:* The 307 Questions Jesus Asked and the 3 He Answered. It is not necessary to have read the book ahead of time.

Following the service, the Faith Formation Team will host a reception in the Narthex with tea sandwiches and cookies (to tide participants over 'til lunch). We will then re-convene in the Sanctuary for a more in-depth look at the questions Jesus asked followed by a time of discussion.



About the book: Contrary to some common assumptions, Jesus is not the ultimate Answer Man, but more like the Great Questioner. In the Gospels, Jesus asks many more questions than he answers. To be precise, Jesus asks 307 questions. He is asked 183 of which he only answers 3. Asking questions was central to Jesus' life and teachings. In fact, for every question he answers directly, he asks—literally—a hundred. Jesus is the Question considers the questions Jesus asks—what they tell us about Jesus and, more important, what our responses might say about what it means to follow Him.

About the preacher and writer: The Rev. Martin B. Copenhaver is an ordained minister in the United Church of Christ. He served as a local church pastor for thirty-four years. He was Senior Pastor of Wellesley Village Church in Wellesley, Massachusetts for twenty years (1994-2014) before becoming president of Andover Newton Theological School (2014-2019), which is the oldest graduate school of any kind in the country. While serving as president, Andover Newton sold its Boston-area campus and moved to New Haven, Connecticut in order to become an affiliated seminary of Yale Divinity School. Martin is the author of nine books and is a Contributing Editor of *The Christian Century* magazine.

MISSION STATEMENT:

The Faith Formation Ministry educates, inspires and grows disciples in Christ.



During 2023, our congregation-wide faith study initiative is *Seasons of Psalms*. The Psalms were Jesus' prayer book and the hymnbook for the public worship of God in ancient Israel. The early Christians sang and prayed the Psalms as well. However, we are not to simply read or sing or pray the Psalms. We are to be immersed in them so that they profoundly shape how we relate to God.

Yes, it is already March, but it is never too late to join in. Participation is simple! The 150 Psalms have been arranged by season and week on the Seasons of Psalms reading plan.

- ◆Read or listen to the 1-4 outlined Psalm(s) each week.
- Re-read and meditate on the Psalmist's words throughout the week.
- •Choose to purchase a copy of "Praying with the Psalms, A Year of Daily Prayers and Reflections on the Words of David" by Eugene Peterson or "The Songs of Jesus, A Year of Daily Devotions in the Psalms" by Timothy Keller, available for purchase on Amazon.
- Choose to Dig Deeper by participating in upcoming study opportunities during Sunday School or other announced sessions.

"How to Read and Pray the Psalms"



AUDIO VISUAL PROJECT UPDATE

As we have all witnessed, to date the AV project has been a great success. We have made tremendous progress with the audio in the sanctuary. The acoustical tiles, digital programable speakers, and the new soundboard have made a big difference for all of us. On the video side we have begun to be able to use some of the equipment on a limited basis. The projector and screen have been used by the FH team, and Chris has used it for her class on the Psalms. We have also used the rear monitor to be able to show the cross that used to be hanging there.

However, we still have much to be completed before we are fully operational. The live streaming equipment still needs to be updated. Microphone jacks need to be installed for the bells and guest musicians. The balance of our video capabilities needs to be completed. And in addition, there is still wiring that needs to be properly positioned.





THE GREEN TEAM (AKA—THE EARTH CARE TEAM)

SPRING HAS SPRUNG IN THE LOWCOUNTRY! WATCH THE E-BLAST AND BULLETIN FOR EARTH CARE ACTIVITIES IN MARCH/APRIL!

Here is a Lenten devotional by Rev. Dr. Paul Galbreath:

"Remember you are earth and earth you shall become."

These words taken from the creation story in Genesis 3 accompany the action of being marked by the sign of the cross on Ash Wednesday. It is a way to remind us of our limits – these days of our lives that we share on this fragile planet. This day invites us to look at ourselves as part of the earth, taken from the ground, breathed into life by the gift of air, and returned to the earth. The season of Lent invites us on a journey to reconnect with the earth. It is a chance to no longer look at ourselves apart from the earth, but to see ourselves as deeply part of the earth, the source of our life, and the place to which we will return. It is a challenging word and also a word of hope since our future is bound up with the future of the earth. Caring for the earth is a way of caring for ourselves.

We are invited this Lenten season to reflect on our relationship with the earth and to choose ways to act that care for the earth. It is a journey that we share together as we travel towards the hope of sharing resurrection life for ourselves and for all of creation. You are asked to commit to new practices of earth care during the coming weeks – a way of building new habits that show that baptismal life includes a commitment to care for the earth as central to Christian discipleship. For example, you may choose to focus on conserving your use of water or decide to pick up trash in a park near you each week.

Consider that your earth care practice is also a form of embodied prayer – a way to work for the healing of the earth.

- Elected Elder Pam Davis-Webb as Commissioner to represent LPC at the Charleston Atlantic Presbytery Spring meeting on May 16, 2023.
