An Unlikely Lent - Notice the unexpected in Easter


Has Easter become as routine for you as Christmas?



“The Sermon On The Mount” Bible Study, Tuesdays at 2:15pm, will conclude on February 10th and the study topic will be “life and death choices”.


“Short Stories of God’s Presence”


Men of Purpose

Backpack Buddies

Backpack Buddies is a volunteer organization that relies on grants and donations to provide food, for food challenged students in the Bluffton area. School social workers decide which of two programs (the Box Program or the Bag Program) they will participate in. The Box Program provides the student with food and staples for one month. The Bag Programs provides the student with a bag of food each Friday.

Currently there are 290 students participating in the Box Program and 250 students (1000 bags per month) in the Bag Programs. 70 of the Bag Students are at Red Cedar Elementary where LPC members bag and distribute the food.

A new program recently added is now providing the 540 students with a once a month bag of fresh produce. This program (ordering, packing and distribution) is being run by volunteers from Palmetto Bluff.

During the summer BPB's participates in the Bluffton Farmer's Market. Participating families receive wooden coins which they then use to buy fresh produce from the local farmers and vendors. Last summer the families also received a themed bag each week (a pizza bag, breakfast bag, and taco bag to name a few) along with vouchers for such things as milk, eggs and ground beef.

LPC packed and distributed bags in September and November and are currently doing so in January. We alternate months with Lord of Life Lutheran Church. 
